Jeanne Lupton leads writing groups in the East Bay and hosts Frank Bette Center for the Arts Second Saturday Poetry and Prose Reading Series in Alameda. Her tanka collection, *but then you danced*, appeared in 2007. She is a frequent feature at Bay area poetry venues and performed her dramatic monologue *Bridge* at Julia Morgan Theater and elsewhere in spring and summer 2009.



Ruth L. Schwartz is the author of four award-winning books of poetry, including *Edgewater*, a National Poetry Series winner and *Dear Good Naked Morning*, selected for the 2003 Autumn House prize. She has also published a memoir, *Death in Reverse*, and her poetry and prose have appeared in many literary magazines and anthologies.



Andrena Zawinski's collections include *Traveling In Reflected Light* (1995), Kenneth Patchen Prize in Poetry, *Greatest Hits 1991-2001*, *Taking The Road Where It Leads* (2008), *Something About* (2009). Her work has appeared in *Psychological Perspectives Journal of Jungian Thought*, *Progressive Magazine*, *Pacific Review*, *Gulf Coast*, *Quarterly West*, and elsewhere. She founded and organizes the Women's Poetry Potluck Salon, and is also Features Editor at PoetryMagazine.com.

Directions:

Coming from the north and heading south on 680, go west on 580, taking the Foothill Rd - San Ramon Rd exit. Turn right at the end of the exit, moving over to the extreme left lane. [If coming from the west on 580, take the first exit at the bottom of the 580 eastbound grade, follow the signs to Dublin which places you on San Ramon Rd heading north]. Turn left at Dublin Blvd. Go one block and turn left on Donlon Way. The Dublin Heritage Center and church is on your right side; enter parking just past the church.
